- Make a small scale or large scale collage of a lifeboat using a variety of different materials.
- Discuss safety at the seaside, role of lifeguards, warning signs/flags.
- Usit the lifeboat station, discuss the role of lifeboats.
- Make sandcastles of different shapes and sizes.
- Explore the different textures of wet and dry sand.
- PDraw pictures in wet sand using different items.
- SUse coloured sand to make patterns.
