Ownership	The manor of Wooler was a caput of the barony of Muschamp, and was held by the king. It had been conferred by Henry I on the Muschamp family. In 1250 Robert Muschamp died leaving three daughters which divided the manor. These moieties passed through, amongst others, the Graham, Meinhill, Huntercumbe, Conyers, Dacre, Lilburn, Arundel and Grey families. In 1561 when negotiations between Sir Ralph Grey and the Crown were ongoing, he was credited with the barony of Wooler, in 1568 Thomas Grey of Chillingham was said to hold both the manor and vill in chief. It remained with the Grey family and passed to Mary, daughter of Lord Grey, Viscount Glendale and earl of Tankerville in 1714. It has remained with the earls of Tankerville and in 1921 the Earl of Tankerville is recorded as lord of the manor and principal landowner.
