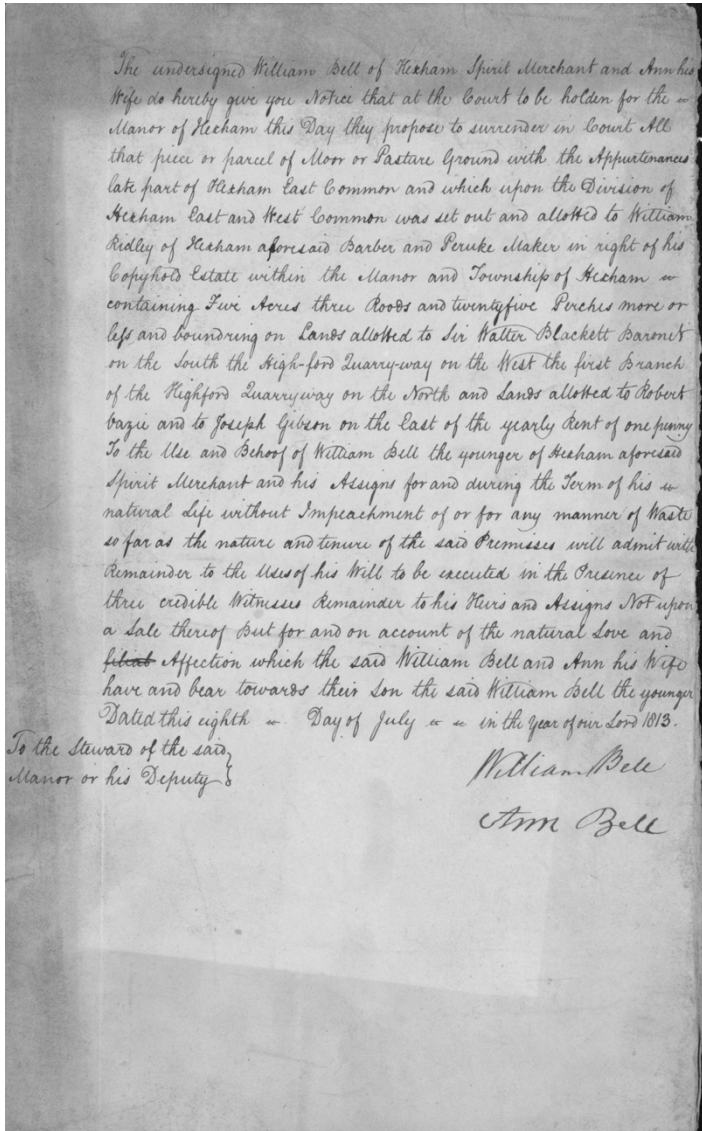

Notice of intent to surrender land at Hexham, William and Ann Bell, to their son, William Bell, 8 July 1813.



The undersigned William Bell of Hexham Spirit Merchant and Ann his Wife do hereby give you Notice that at the Court to be holden for the ¹ Manor of Hexham this Day they propose to surrender in Court All that piece or parcel of Moor or Pasture Ground with the Appurtenances late part of Hexham East Common and which upon the Division of Hexham East and West Common was set out and allotted to William Ridley of Hexham aforesaid Barber and Puke Maker in right of his Copyhold Estate within the Manor and Township of Hexham ¹ containing Five Acres three Roods and twentyfive Perches more or less and bounding on Lands allotted to Sir Walter Blackett Baronet on the South the High-ford Quarry-way on the West the first Branch of the Highford Quarryway on the North and Lands allotted to Robert Vazie and to Joseph Gibson on the East of the yearly Rent of one penny To the Use and Behoof of William Bell the younger of Hexham aforesaid Spirit Merchant and his Assigns for and during the Term of his ¹ natural Life without Impeachment of or for any manner of Waste so far as the nature and tenure of the said Premises will admit with Remainder to the Uses of his Will to be executed in the Presence of three credible Witnesses Remainder to his Heirs and Assigns Not upon a Sale thereof But for and on account of the natural Love and filial Affection which the said William Bell and Ann his Wife have and bear towards their Son the said William Bell the younger Dated this eighth ¹ Day of July ¹ in the Year of our Lord 1813.
