Notice of intent to surrender Lilswood in Newlands and Rowley Ward, William Currey to John Stokeld and Elizabeth his wife, 27 April 1814.

I William Currey of Lilswood Yeoman do hereby give you Notice that at the Court to be holden for the Manor of Hexham the Day I propose to surrender in Court The Moiety or half part of the Moiety of One Tenement in Newlands and Rowley Ward within this Manor and commonly called Lilswood and which Moiety or Half part consists of the Great House with the Byer and Stable adjoining situate at Lilswood on the North side of the Strand And also the several Fields Closes or Parcels of Land following that is to say, the Great field and the High field both which are situate on the East side of the said House and on the same side of the Strand the White Hill and the Far and Nether Pasture, saving and always reserving unto the Heirs and Assigns of John Natrass late of Lilswood aforesaid Husbandman deceased and their Tenants and Farmers full Right Liberty and Authority to depasture their Sheep in the Far and Nether Pasture from Martinmas till Ladyday in every Year Rent 3/.
