Notice of intent to surrender property at Wall, Edward Stobart to James Magnay, 8 July 1813.

I Edward Stobart of Wall Husbandman do hereby give you notice that at the Court to be holden for the Manor of Hexham this Day I propose to surrender in Court One House with the Barn Byer and Garth to the same adjoining and belonging situate and being in the Town of Wall aforesaid and also all that piece or parcel of arable Meadow or Pasture Ground with the Appurtenances late part of the Moor or Common belonging to the Township of Wall aforesaid which was allotted to one John Stobart deceased upon the Division of the said Moor or Common containing One Acre and one Rood more or less and bounding on Grounds allotted to William Shaftoe on the South the Ground set out for a Common watering place on the West and Northwest Ground allotted to John Nicholson on the North and Ground allotted to Thomas Daglease on the East Rent 2 d. And the Reversions and Equity of Redemption thereof and all his Estate Right Title and Interest therein To the Use and Behoof of James Magnay late of Fallowfield but now of Wall aforesaid Joinir his Heirs and Assigns Not upon a Sale thereof but by way of Mortgage for securing the Repayment of the further Sum Fifty Pounds with Interest for the same after the Rate of Five Pounds for One hundred Pounds by the Year (in addition to the Sum of Fifty Pounds formerly lent secured upon the same) on the Eighth ~ day of ~~November~~ <sup>January</sup> next Dated this Eighth ~ day of July ~ in the Year of our Lord 1813.
