Notice of intent to surrender House Hill in Newlands and Rowley Ward, John Ord to Richard Angus, 27 April 1814.

I John Ord late of Hamburn Hall but now of West Brokenheugh
Yeoman a Devisee named in and by the last Will and Testament
of Thomas Ord late of Barkerhouse in Hexhamshire in the County
of Northumberland Surgeon deceased do hereby give you Notice
that at the Court to be holden for the Manor of Hexham this
day I propose to surrender in Court One Tenement with the
Appurtenances situate and being in Newlands and Rowley Ward
and commonly called House hill containing by Estimation Five
Acres of Ground more or less of the yearly Rent of Sixpence
And also all that piece or parcel of arable Meadow pasture
Ground with the Appurtenances lying and being on Dotland
Common and formerly part and parcel of the same but set
out and allotted to Thomas Ord upon the Division of the
said Common in right of the said Tenement containing
Eight Acres two Roods and two Perches of Land more or less
and bounding on the Shire Road on the South the Oxen
Road on the West and the Parkhead on the North To the
Use and behoof of Richard Angus of Juniper Dyehouse
Bleacher and Dyer his Heirs and Assigns Not upon a
Sale thereof but by way of a Mortgage for securing the
Repayment of the sum of Two hundred Pounds with
Interest for the same after the Rate of Five Pounds for
each One hundred Pounds by the Year on the twentyseventh
Day of October — now next Dated the twentyseventh
Day of April — in the Year of our Lord 1814.
