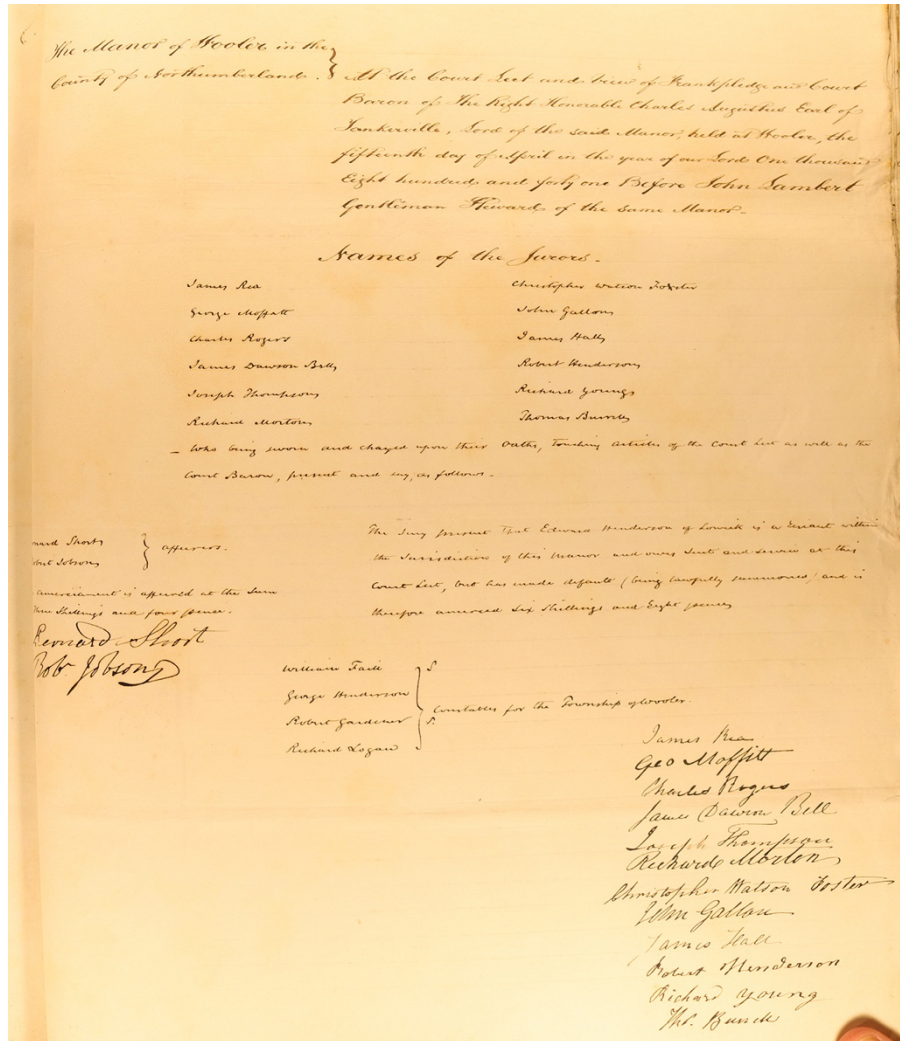

The Manor of Wooler in the County of Northumberland

At the Court Leet and View of Frankpledge and Court Baron of the Right Honorable Charles Augustus Earl of Tankerville, Lord of the said Manor held at Wooler, the fifteenth day of April in the year of our Lord, One thousand Eight hundred and forty one Before John Lambert Gentleman Steward of the same Manor.

The jury present that Edward Henderson of Lowick is a tenant within the jurisdiction of this manor and owes suit and service at this Court Leet, but has made default (being lawfully summoned) and is therefore amerced Six Shillings and Eight pence.
