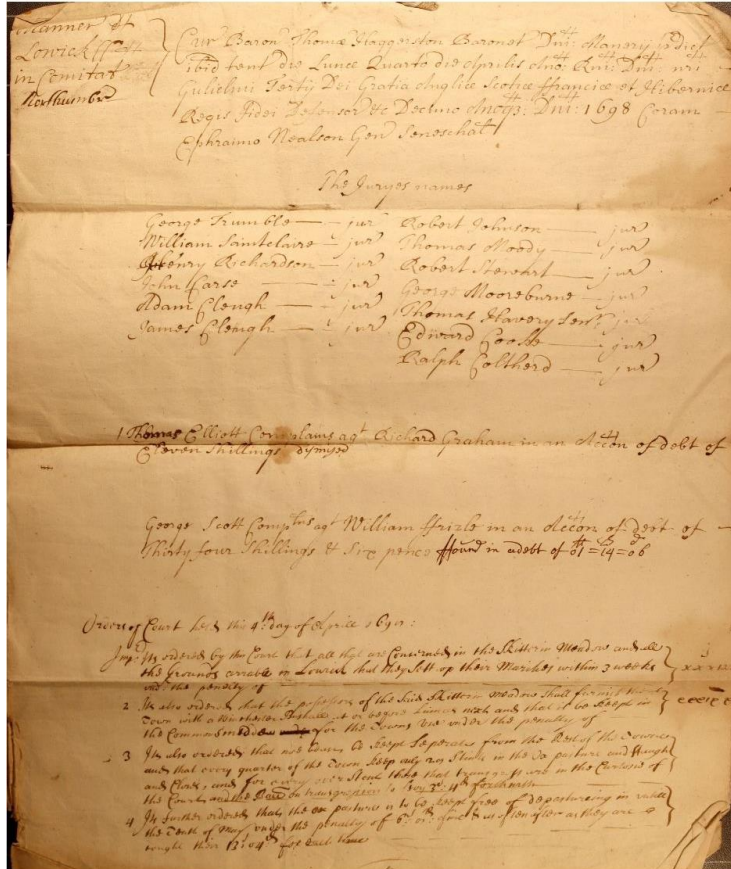

Orders of court held this 4th: day of April 1698:

Imp[re]m[is]: Its ordered by this Court that all that are Concerned in the Skitter[2] in Meadow and all the Grounds arable in Lowick that they Sett up their Marches within 3 weeks und[er] the penalty of ----- xxxix xi

2 Its also ordered that the possessors of the said Skitter in meadow shall furnish the Town with a Winchester Bushall at or before Lamas next and that it be kept in the Commons midden ~~xxx~~ for the Towns use under the penalty of xxxix xi

3 Its also ordered that noe beasts be kept Separate from the Rest of the Towne and that every quarter of the Town keep only 28 Stints in the Ox pasture and Haugh and Closes, and for every over Stent there that transgress are in the Curtosie of the Court and the Ba[iliff]s on transgression to levy 3 s: 4 d forthwith -----

4 Its further ordered that the ox pasture is to be kept free of depastureing in untill the Tenth of May under the penalty of 6 s: 8 d: fine & as often after as they are - caught their 13 s: 04 d for each time -----
