Ownership	Tweedmouth and Spital adjoin each other, Spital, which in reality is a part of Tweedmouth, derives its name from the old hospital which used to be located in that area.  Since the beginning of its recorded history Tweedmouth was a portion of the patrimony of St Cuthbert and belonged to the Bishops of Durham. This ownership continued up until the time of Elizabeth I. When the See of Durham was divided Tweedmouth fell to the earl of Suffolk from whom it passed by sale in 1657 to the Corporation of Berwick which are still recorded as owners in 1921.
