We do hereby give you Notice that at the Court to be holden for the Manor of Hexham this Day we propose to surrender in Court All that Tenement with the Appurtenances called Hairsley, lying in West Allen of the Yearly Rent of Seven Shillings and Sixpence And also the Allotments and Stints allotted and awarded in respect thereof upon the Division of certain Parts and Stinting of the Residue of Allendale Common as the same are in the Award made upon the said Division particularly described and set forth To the Use and Behoof of Peter Keir the younger of Hexham Heelmaker his Heirs and Assigns Not upon a Sale thereof but by Way of Mortgage for securing to the Reverend Abraham Brown of Mollersteads Clerk for whom the said Peter Keir is a trustee the Repayment of the Sum of Four hundred Pounds Sterling with Interest by the undernamed Matthew Lee, at 5 l. Per Cent^[a] Ann^[um].
