Notice of intent to surrender property at Acomb, John Taylor to William Charlton, 25 May 1809.

Taylor to Charlton Wm

I do hereby give you Notice that at the Court to be holden for the Manor of Hexham this Day I propose to surrender in Court All that Stone house and Garth is behind the same situate and being in the Town of Acomb And all that new erected Shop and Room above the said Shop, And all that new erected Stable and Room above the said Stable bounding on the House and Garth of Simon Newburn on the East, the House and Lands late of William Ridley and now of on the West, the Lands late of Edward Nicholson and now of George Nicholson on the North and the King's Street on the South with all and singular the Appurtenances of the Yearly Rent of Two Pence To the Use and Behoof of William Charlton of Acomb aforesaid Plasterer and his Assigns for and during the Term of his natural Life without Impeachment of or for any Manner of Waste so far as the Nature and Tenure of the said Premises will admit with Remainder to the uses of his Will to be executed in the Presence of three Witnesses Remainder to his Heirs and Assigns Upon a Sale of the same Premises made by me to him in Consideration of three hundred pounds Purchase Money agreed to be paid by him to me for same Dated this Twenty fifth Day of May in the Year of our Lord 1809.
