Notice of intent to surrender property at Hexham, Matthew Chester to
Lancelot Liddell, 1 June 1809.

I do hereby give you Notice that at the Court to be holden for the Manor of Hexham this Day I and Sarah my Wife propose to surrender in Court One — Burgage or Stone-house with the Appurtenances situate standing and being in the Town of Hexham aforesaid in a Place there called the Old Burn Head, of the yearly Rent of three Pence And one Parcel of Arable Meadow or Pasture Ground lying in Gilligate Fields containing by Estimation the Moiety or Half Part of One Acre of Ground and known by the Name of the Peth-gate otherwise Peth Gate with the Appurtenances of the yearly Rent of Twopence halfpenny And also Two Roods of Arable or Meadow Ground lying in the West Fields of Hexham aforesaid called Gilligate Fields in a certain Place there called or known by the Name of the Burn Close otherwise Cockshaw Close of the yearly Rent of threepence To the Use and Behoof of Lancelot Liddell of Hexham aforesaid Gentleman his Heirs and Assigns, Not upon a Sale thereof but by Way of Mortgage for securing the Repayment of the Sum of One hundred Pounds with Interest for the same after the Rate of 5^l. by the Year on the First Day of December now next ensuing. Dated this First Day of June in the Year of our Lord 1809.
