Ownership	 Thockrington manor was in the possession of the Umframvills in the twelfth century. In the thirteenth century the church and vill were acquired by the church of York in two separate transactions. In 1368 Archbishop Thoresby granted a lease of the manor to Roger Widdrington, in around 1518 the archbishop of York conveys the manor of Thockrington to the Shafto family. The family of Fossor were also settled in the parish from a very early period and continued to be associated with it until 1782 when the last heir, Basil Forcer, died without issue. In 1716 the manor seems to be forfeited to the Crown by William Shafto however the manor must have been regained by the Shafto family as Thockrington continues as a portion of the Shafto estates to the present day. In 1921 Delaval Shafto is recorded as lord of the manor.
