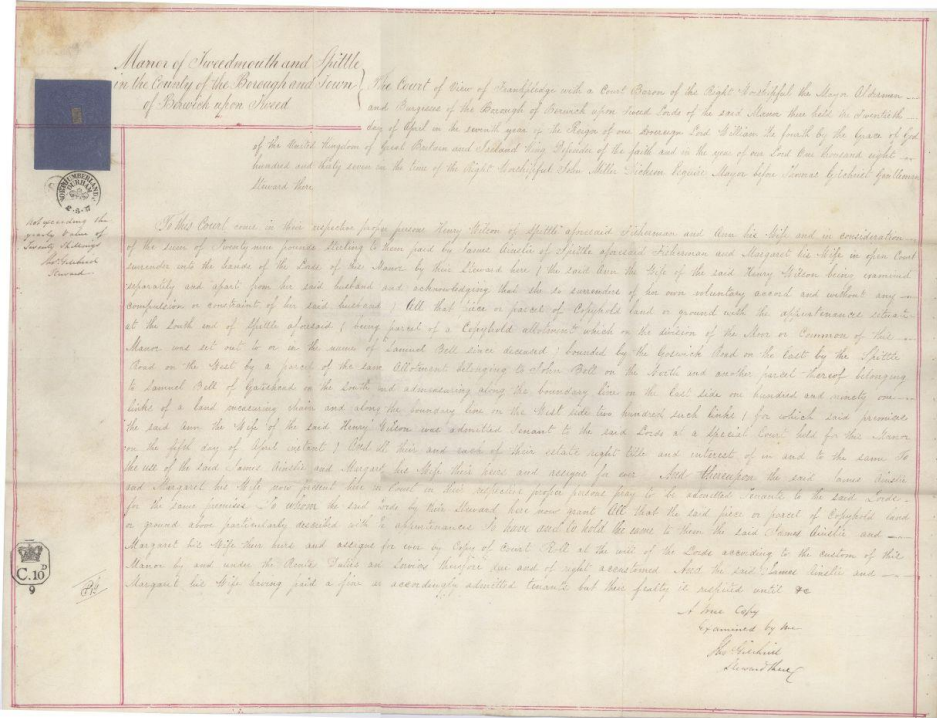

 The Court of View of Frankpledge with a Court Baron of the Right Worshippful the Mayor Aldermen
 and Burgesses of the Borough of Berwick upon Tweed Lords of the said Manor here held the Twentieth
 day of April in the seventh year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord William the fourth by the Grace of God
 of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland King Defender of the faith and in the year of our Lord One thousand eight
 hundred and thirty seven in the line of the Right Worshippful John Miller Dickson Esquire Mayor before Thomas Gickchrist Gentelman
 Steward there

Not exceeding the yearly Value of Twenty Shillings Tho[m]as Gickchrist Steward

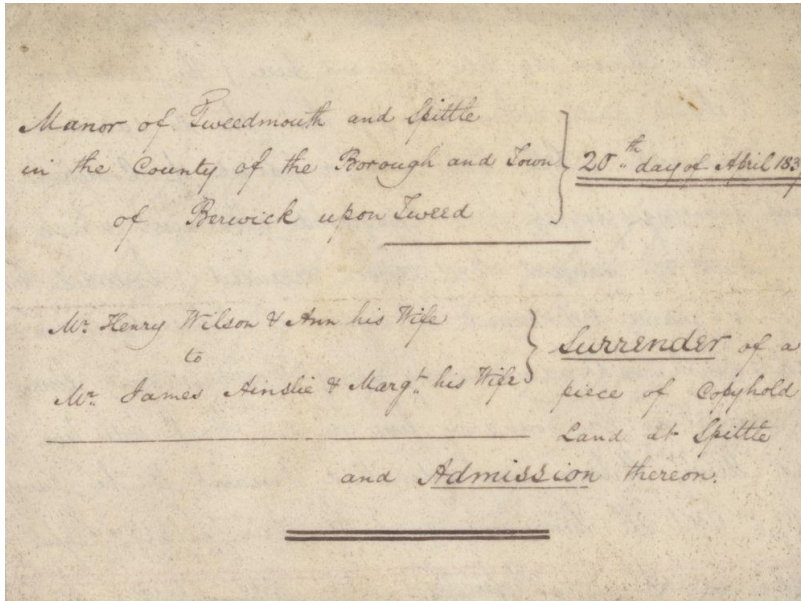
To this Court come in their respective proper persons Henry Wilson of Spittle aforesaid Fisherman and Ann his Wife and in consideration
 of the Sum of Twenty nine pounds Sterling to them paid by James Ainslie of Spittle aforesaid Fisherman and Margaret his Wife in open Court
 surrender into the hands of the Lords of this Manor by their Steward here, the said Ann the Wife of the said Henry Wilson being examined
 separately and apart from her said husband and acknowledging that she so surrenders of her own voluntary accord and without any
 compulsion or constraint of her said husband, All that piece or parcel of Copyhold land or ground with the appurtenances situate
 at the South end of Spittle aforesaid, being parcel of a Copyhold allotment which on the division of the Moor or Common of this
 Manor was set out to or in the name of Samuel Bell since deceased, bounded by the Gerswick Road on the East by the Spittle
 Road on the West by a parcel of the same Allotment belonging to John Bell on the North and another parcel thereof belonging
 to Samuel Bell of Galeshead on the South and admeasuring along the boundary line on the East side one hundred and ninety one
 links of a land measuring chain and along the boundary line on the West side two hundred such links, for which said premises
 the said Ann the Wife of the said Henry Wilson was admitted Tenant to the said Lords at a Special Court held for this Manor
 on the fifth day of April instant, And all their and each of their estate right title and interest of in and to the same To
 the use of the said James Ainslie and Margaret his Wife their heirs and assigns for ever And thereupon the said James Ainslie
 and Margaret his Wife now present here in Court in their respective proper persons pray to be admitted Tenants to the said Lords
 for the same premises To whom the said Lords by their Steward here now grant All that the said piece or parcel of Copyhold land
 or ground above particularly described with the appurtenances To have and to hold the same to them the said James Ainslie and
 Margaret his Wife their heirs and assigns for ever by Copy of Court Roll at the will of the Lords according to the custom of this
 Manor and under the Rents Duties and Services therefor due and of right accustomed And the said James Ainslie and
 Margaret his Wife having paid a fee are accordingly admitted tenants but their yearly is respited until &c
