M[ister] Mayor & Justices

The Regard which we have to the Oaths we are under, diligently to enquire, and truly to present, the Several abuses that Ive within our Cognizance as Jurors, has brought us to make the impartial Presentments, which we now lay before you.

The almost Universal Complaint which we meet with in our Walk, of the Non-Employment of Power, in the punishment of Offenders and Removal of Offences, forbids Us to forbear acquainting you with that general Sense. And we cannot help Saying it with Some Earnestness. that it grieves Us, not only to hear our Selves reflected on as a formal Set of Men, sent about to no purpose; but that we should have occasion to repeat the Notice of Nusances, Some of them presented Six Months ago; and Some others of Twenty times that Standing

We can do no more, than make a true Representac[i]on of Such persons and things, as are culpable and punishable. The Judicial Authority to punish and the power of giving Laws a vigorous Execution are altogether lodged in You: We beg therefore your Worships Serious Inspecc[i]on into the Nusances and Annoyances before mentioned; and that the good Laws which we have the happiness to live under, may be attended with that, In the want whereof only, they can be called a

This we are Sure will effectually Silence the just Complaints of the Unredressed aggrieved; and not only redound abundantly to yo[ure] Honour, but also give a general Satisfacc[i]on to all Such as desire the wellfare of the place; and more particularly to
