<b>Manor Name</b>	ACKLINGTON
<b>Alias</b>	Aklinton
<b>Honour/Lordship</b>	Barony of Warkworth
<b>Ownership</b>	<p>In 1248 Roger fitz John was Lord of Acklington, the manor is still recorded with the family in 1309. At some point after this Acklington passes into Percy hands as the Inquest Post Mortem in 1352 for Henry de Percy includes a description of Acklington and its tenants.</p> <p>The manor of Acklington has remained with the Percy's as principal landowners and lords of the manor.</p> <p>In 1859 Acklington and Acklington Park were severed from the parish of Warkworth and together with the extra parochial chapelry of Guyzance were constituted an ecclesiastical parish. The parish church of St. John was built in 1861, the benefice is a parcel of the rectory of Warkworth</p>
