Ownership	A member of the barony of Baliol the township was occupied in 1268 by four and a half bondage tenants of Sir John de Baliol. In 1414 William Lowery held a tenement of land from the lord. In 1525 the grange of Acom was held at the lord's will, of the earl of Westmorland, by Richard Weldon. In 1623 various tenements were granted to Sir Henry Fane, knight. By letters patent dated 2nd June 1625 lands at Acomb were granted to Edward Allen, Robert Ducie, George Whitmore and other citizens of London as part satisfaction of a debt of James I to the city of London. The whole township was acquired by the Fenwicks of Bywell in the 1660s and since then has belonged to the successive owners of Bywell Hall. Wentworth Henry Canning Beaumont, 2rd Viscount Allendale occupied Bywell Hall in the 1920s.
