Ownership	In 1262 Robert de West Heddon held Heddon and Appeltreley of the Lord of Bywell by the service of a third part of a knight's fee. These lands were later forfeited to the crown by Robert de West Heddon because of his part in Gilbert de Middleton's rebellion. These lands were then sold by Edward III to Roger de Widdrington.
	Little is known of the vill until the seventeenth century when it had passed into the possession of the Boutflower family. In 1766 when William Boutflower died the seat and house were offered for sale. It was purchased by the Surtees of Hamsterley and around1900 passed to co-heiresses of the late Mr Robert Smith Surtees, Miss Surtees and Lady Gort.
	In 1921 Eleanor, Viscountess Gort is listed as the principal land owner.
